Events report: January to July 2020

This event was organized on Thursday, January 30th, 2020 to foster a bonding experience for the members of the Alumni group. The event which was held in Lekki, Lagos was attended by about 50% of the members of the group and graced by the founder, Mr Austin Okere and Chris Stephenson, a member of the faculty from the UK.

CSR Events

In line with one of our key objectives to render service to society that will positively impact national development, the association decided to use the power of its ecosystem to launch an educational initiative tagged 'Educating Offline communities'.

The initiative was targeted at individuals at the bottom of the pyramid of the society, without access to virtual education structures.

Our mission is to deliver education and inclusive services to primary school students starting from Lagos by partnering with industry leaders, and top-performing organizations to deliver these objectives in conjunction with governments, NGOs and social enterprises to provide people living in poverty with inspiration, and education.



Outings

1: German Quarters, Lekki, Lagos

So far, the group has executed 3 outings in Lagos, Nigeria. The first was launched on Saturday, 2nd of May at German Quarters, Lekki, Lagos, where an initial 150 kids were impacted in an introductory literacy and feeding program.

After a review of the first outing, we decided on a firm intervention programme targeted at the education of the kids especially in the period their schools remained closed. This made the group consider the inclusion of radio sets in its intervention package as well as an introduction of programmes/stations that were presenting primary and secondary school curriculum based teachings.



Radio sets were distributed to households and food packs were distributed to the kids presented individually.

3: Festus Keyamo Close, Gbagada, Lagos

Our third outing took the group to the mainland of Lagos. We visited the community in Festus Keyamo Close, Gbagada with radio sets, food packs and water.

This time, rather than inform them of the radio programmes to listen to verbally, printed a set of fliers that accompanied each package. This will help the kids and their parents/guardians conveniently remember the programmes schedules.

Considering the required mandate for common entrance exams to take place in the next few weeks, we employed a primary school pupil-teacher to take on extra lessons 3 days a week on the following subjects: Mathematics, Quantitative verbal, English, Vocational, Current Affairs and General studies.
